Purpose: Canadian Tire JumpStart provides financial disadvantaged children with the opportunity to participate in sports and organized recreation. This includes any organized physical activity. Listed below are some general guidelines for the selection of sport and recreational activities:

- Program must be designed to get children physically active.
- Funding goes to individuals, not to teams.
- Preference will be given to funding lower cost activities to allow more children to receive funding.
- Funding should be for a sustained program that lasts a season (i.e. a one week sport camp would not qualify)
- Funding is allocated three times a year

Program Guidelines

- Open to children ages 5 to 18 years of age
- Work towards as equal split as possible on funding for both girls and boys.
- Funding up to \$200.00 per child.
- Funding is available for members of the same family for the same season.
- Funding can be provided to same child for successive seasons.
- 100% of the money raised is to go to the direct benefit of the child. No funds are to be used to pay for administration or for any other use.
- Funding preference is to pay for registration fees, with consideration given to fund equipment costs.
